Use this immunization chart by checking off the boxes of the completed vaccinations of your child. Your provincial vaccination requirements/recommendations will probably be very similar, but please consult with your physician to ensure that your baby is receiving all the care that he/she needs.

NOTE: The measles, mumps, rubella and varicella vaccines are live virus vaccines. If not given on the same day, they must be given at least 28 days apart.

* Measles, mumps and rubella vaccine must be given after the first birthday.

** If your child has not had chicken pox or the vaccine, he/she can receive the chicken pox vaccine at 5 years of age.

† These vaccines can be given as early as 12 months of age.

‡ If your child has not had the meningococcal c-conjugate vaccine (at 1 year of age), then he/she can receive the vaccine at 12 years of age or in grade 7.

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
